A part of Melgaço's area is located in Portugal's most important preserved area, Peneda-Gerês National Park, which is recognised as World Biosphere Reserve by UNESCO.

HIKING & DISCOVERING

The route starts in the village of Castro Laboreiro, at the intersection of the church (next to the information panel).

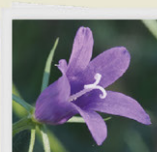
From here, you go through a smooth path, following at approximately the same altitude and granting some amplitude of observation. If you look to your left side, into the horizon, an important rock formation appears on the slope of Serra da Peneda, as a result of granitic weathering, the **Castle koppie** (A) - particular form of inselberg ("Hill - Island"), castellated with dominant orthogonal and vertical fractures. This is one of the best examples of granitic geological forms of greater dimension in Peneda-Gerês National Park, and, therefore, an element to consider in the interpretation of the geological heritage of this region. Shortly after, you cross Porto Seco stream, the old **Veigas Bridge** (B) and you reach the leisure area under the same name. It is a large space with a picnic area, several wooden benches, and tables, as well as a children's playground and a sports centre. Just before the village of Vido, you will see the hill that will take you in a gradual ascent from 1000 to 1100 metres of altitude. Upon reaching the

highest point (approx. 1100 meters), you can enjoy a forest with **Scots pines and birches** (C), an important place of shelter for various faunal species. Just after the forest, the route heads north, **flanking a small wetland (hygroturf complex)** (D). A few metres further, you will begin a steep descent, through thickets and rocky outcrops, to Porta de Lamas De Mouro, an informative and interpretive tourist space about the National Park.

Fauna: red-billed chough (*Pyrrhocorax pyrrhocorax*), Iberian pointed Frog (*Discoglossus galganoi*), Iberian wolf (*Canis lupus signatus*)

PRECAUTIONS DURING THE TRAIL



Wear sensible clothes and shoes: mountain boots, a hat and a raincoat.



Do not disturb natural habitats.



Respect the signposted trail and pay attention to the markings.



Do not litter, take the rubbish to the appropriate container.



Respect private property. Make sure all gates are closed.



Do not make fire and do not throw cigarettes on the floor.



Leave nature unspoilt: do not collect plants, animals or rocks.



Do not start the trail under severe weather conditions such as fog and snow.



Avoid walking alone in the mountain and always carry water.



When there is high or very high risk of wildfires, **access might be limited.**



Be polite to locals.



Beware of cattle. Do not approach litters or cubs



(*) The route can be travelled at any time of year, but some precautions should be taken in summer due to the high temperatures, and in winter due to the low temperatures, the possibility of fog and snowfall and the accumulation of water in some sections.

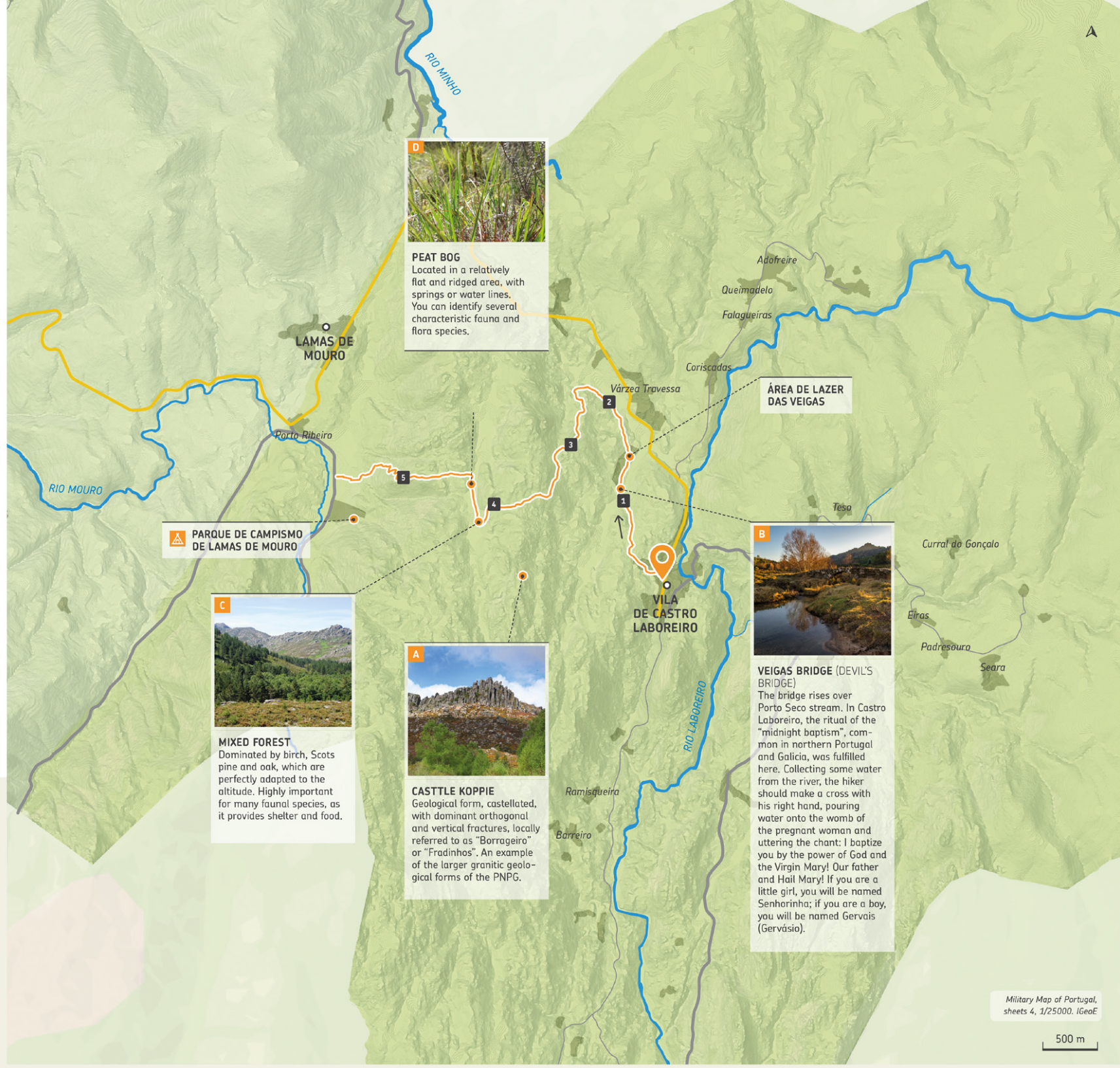
