



The Vez Glacier Valley Trail starts at Branda Da Aveleira, a mountain plateau at the northern end of Serra da Peneda.

The route starts next to a small and pleasant lake and heads towards the Chapel of Nossa Senhora da Guia.

Many rocky occurrences can and should be understood as many other documents of an even older history, processed over millions and millions of years. They are the memory of earth and life and are part of our natural heritage.

There are currently no glaciers in Portugal, but you can find traces of their existence. In the northwest mountains of Portugal, glacial remains are very frequent, namely in Serra da Peneda, a beautiful mountain, around 1400 m high, where marks of large icy masses resulting from the accumulation and compaction of thick layers of ice are confirmed.

Geologically speaking, in Branda Da Aveleira shales predominate. However, several traces of glacial deposits can be found when palming the territory. "Aborregado" rocks (D), polished and striated surfaces, moraines (C), "till" type deposits and erratic blocks (B) of granite based on the shale are frequent. These traces resulted from the last Quaternary glaciation, the Wurm glaciation.

Right after the beginning of the route, you reach the confluence of the Aveleira River with the Vez River. You slowly enter the valley through which the ancient glacier passed, thousands of years ago, formed by a huge mass of ice, shaping the surface of the mountain, forming the characteristic **U-shaped** (A) valley.

Fauna: Common buzzard (Buteo buteo), Iberian wolf (Canis lupus signatus), red fox (Vulpes vulpes)






Flora: Common broom (Cytisus scoparius), Heather (Calluna vulgaris), Hawthorn (Crataegus monogyna)



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
